

Founded by Parker McMullen Bushman, the Equity in Conservation and Outdoor Recreation (E.C.O.R.) Summit for Action is a two-day event for thought-provoking discussions around the intersection of equity and inclusion in environmental conservation and outdoor recreation movements. The outdoors is a place of healing and enjoyment for all. However throughout American history, people of marginalized identities have so often been underrepresented or intentionally excluded from the conservation and outdoor narratives. These inequities are the result of complex social and economic factors that include but are not limited to explicit racism and segregation. Understanding the history and impacts of racism, sexism, ableism in the parks and greenspaces in our communities can only serve to improve the benefits of green spaces to all people.

Building a bridge between the annual convening, the <u>Mukuyu Collective</u>, <u>LLC</u> was contracted to design and facilitate a community of practice (CoP) with participants from the convenings. Twenty convening participants joined the inaugural 2022-23 CoP. Together, we support each other through this reciprocal learning journey, share problems of practice as well as progress, and brainstorm ideas/strategies to address all levels of change – individual, interpersonal, institutional, and systemic – needed for political, socioeconomic, and ecological transformation. Building on this year's Summit theme, the <u>1991 Environmental Justice Principles</u>, this intentional community will reflect, refine, and reimagine these principles to our present moment and near future.

The quarterly convening includes a Land and People Acknowledgement focused on deepening knowledge, relationships, and activation. Renee Millard-Chacon, one of our Summit for Action CoP members, who is a co-founder of Womxn on the Mountain and a current Commerce City Councilwoman, shared the following resources with the CoP during our Winter CoP meeting. Renee offered these resources so that non-indigenous people can be better informed of the current indigenous led activities, know who to connect with, and how we can activate in our communities around shared goals.
